WHO ARE WE?

We are an organization interested in the enjoyment, preservation and promotion of the theatre pipe organ. We are a group who enjoys the great movie palace homes of theatre organs and their history in stage, radio, film & music.

WHAT ARE OUR GOALS?

To preserve & restore theatre pipe organs. To bring the theatre organ art to new audiences through live performances, recordings, media & publications. To bring together those people interested in theatre organ to exchange ideas, socialize, and provide educational programs.

WHO CAN JOIN?

WHEN DO WE MEET?

in the Hudson-Mohawk Chapter. The national ATOS Regular Membership fee is \$50 per year including a subscription to their fine magazine "Theatre Organ", email news, and the entitlement to attend the ATOS National Convention - contact Donna Parker for ATOS membership: d.parker@atos.org. "Goldie", The Mighty WURLTZER

When Proctors Theatre opened in 1926, a theatre pipe organ (patented as the Robert Hope-Jones *Unit Orchestra*) was an integral part of nearly every major "Movie Palace". A single player could create the sound of a full orchestra.

It provided the background music during arrival and intermissions, musical scores & sound effects for silent films, and accompaniment for Vaudeville shows and stage productions. The installation of a three-manual, eighteen-rank Wurlitzer Theatre Organ represented a significant step towards the restoration of Proctors Theatre to its original grandeur.

Built in North Tonawanda, NY in 1931 for the Paramount Theater in Aurora, Illinois, "Goldie", named for its original all-gold finish, was expanded by Claude Newman for his residence in Minneapolis in 1975. Thanks to the success of the Capital Fund Drive and generous contributions from the Golub Family and Golub Foundation, the organ was purchased and delivered to Proctors in July 1983. The installation process was long and involved. It would have been impossible without countless hours of volunteer work by members of the American Theatre Organ Society. One of the country's leading theatre organ experts, Allen Miller, tonally adjusted Goldie to suit Proctors' fine acoustics.

"Goldie" has been expanded to a 23 rank stoplist, improved lighting, all-electric stop action, five digital ranks, enhanced combination system & MIDI capability. These improvements make the organ more reliable, easier to play and more capable than ever before. In addition, the console exterior was authentically and durably refinished.

"George" is a custom Allen GW4, 4 manual 33 rank digital recreation of legendary recording artist George Wright's "Hollywood Philharmonic" studio Wurlitzer. It resides in the GE Theatre when Goldie and the Main Theatre are unavailable for events, concerts, movies, teaching or practicing.
